

The meeting was called to order by Pres. Larry McCoskey at 0900 hrs. in accordance with the association's by-laws, Article I, Section 2, which requires the meeting.

I. Election of Officers: The following members were elected to serve in the respective office for the next two years.

II. Budget overview: Ed Green gave a brief overview of the budget. All receipts and bills had not been received for reunion debits/credits so the total balance was tentatively given as \$12,000+.

III. Reunion report: John Wanko gave an overview of the reunion activities and expenses. The majority of items had been paid and almost all receipts had been forwarded to Ed. Green.

IV. Pictures. All members were encouraged to forward reunion pictures to Jerry Jackson for publishing in the next Ping.

V. In order to insure that the Ping and Web Site will be managed seamlessly, Ron Pervere will be working with Jerry Jackson as a back-up for both in the event Jerry is unable to continue with the duties of Ping Editor and Web Manager. This is strictly a precautionary move to insure that more than one member is well versed on the mechanics of both items.

VI. Ship's Store. Keith Totsch gave an overview of the store's items remaining and indicated that he has had over \$300 in sales at the reunion alone. He was given permission to expand on a limited basis any items he deemed necessary to continue the store's success.

VII. Donations. The following donations were approved by the body:

- \$200 to Tin Can Sailors
- \$100 to the Freedom Foundation
- \$100 to the Congressional Medal of Honor Foundation

VIII. There was no recipient this year for the Jim Holden Award.

IX. A committee of two was formed to investigate what it will take to have a new Navy Destroyer named after Robert A. Owens. Larry McCoskey and John Wanko will be making inquiries to determine if this is possible.

X. It was decided that the next reunion will be held in Charleston, SC. Nobody volunteered to spearhead the reunion, so Larry McCoskey and Bobby Williams agreed to work together to find a hotel and someone in the area to manage this for us. More will be forthcoming in future Pings.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 1030 hrs.



